Lord's Passover from Death to Resurrection

pril 2023 is full of events: Palm Sunday or Passion Sunday, the Holy week having in it "the Paschal Triduum" and finally, Easter Celebrations. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday when Jesus made his final entrance into Jerusalem. Holy Week is the most solemn and glorious week in Christianity, the pinnacle of the liturgical year. It culminates with Easter Sunday.

Holy week commemorates the final week of our Lord's life on earth. It has in it the Sacred Triduum, one great festival recounting the last three days of Jesus' life on earth, the events of his Passion and Resurrection, when the Lamb of God laid down his life in atonement for our sins.

Easter Sunday is what we have all been waiting for! The forty days of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during Lent was in preparation for this day, when our hearts and souls can drink in deeply the culmination of the Paschal mystery: the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead.

The Introductory Rites

A ccording to the Roman Missal, the initial rites range from the gathering of the faithful to the prayer called Collect. The Missal emphasizes the communal character of the Eucharistic celebration in the following words: *"When the people are gathered, the Priest approaches the altar with the ministers while the Entrance Chant is sung"*. The liturgical celebration can never be a personal activity. The two main actors in the liturgy are Christ and the Church. The communal character of the Eucharistic celebration is also expressed by the invitation: Let us pray, and the use of the first person plural: *We ask this...*

During the procession, the choir sings the entrance song. The Roman Missal contains an Entrance Antiphon for each Eucharistic celebration. They should be selected according to the theme of the day. The Entrance Antiphon discloses the liturgical theme that the Church proposes to the faithful. Liturgical songs are not sung at random. Composers of the songs must have a solid theological, liturgical and biblical formation.

Focus on the Holy Mass

The Roman Missal gives an important information about the veneration of the altar in these words: "When he has arrived at the altar, after making a profound bow with the ministers, the Priest venerates the altar with a kiss, and if appropriate, incenses the cross and the altar". In the Eucharistic celebration, the altar holds a special place. It is the center of the celebration since it symbolizes Jesus Christ himself. In fact, the fifth preface of Easter states that Christ is the Priest, the Altar and the Lamb of sacrifice.

Apart from the cross, the candles, and the Missal in some cases, the altar should not have anything on it during the first part of the Eucharistic celebration. It is during the Liturgy of the Eucharist that bread and wine are put on the altar. This helps the faithful understand that the altar is the table of the sacrifice.

After the Entrance song, the Priest and the faithful sign themselves with the sign of the cross while the priest says: *In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.* The cross is the sign of our salvation. In the Holy Mass we celebrate our salvation through the Paschal mystery (Suffering, death and resurrection


of Jesus Christ). After the sign of the cross, the Priest greets the faithful using the following words: *The Lord be with you* or any other words which are indicated in the Missal. The bishop says: *Peace be with you*.

Then comes the moment for the penitential Act. The faithful acknowledge their sins and ask for forgiveness so that the sacrifice may be acceptable to God. This is followed by the *Gloria* song. It is sung on feasts, solemnities, and on Sundays except the Advent and the Lenten seasons. When the *Gloria* song is concluded, the Priest invites the faithful to pray, marks a moment of silence and sings or recites the *Collect* which is referred to as *the Opening Prayer* in other languages. The *collect* is concluded by the long doxology: *Through Jesus Christ your Son who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. Amen.*

The One We Seek to Imitate

T oday's liturgy raises the *tempo* of our preparation towards the celebration of Easter. Palm Sunday, or Passion Sunday, as today is known, draws our attention to Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

This week which precedes the celebration of our Gracious Lord's resurrection from the dead is also called the Holy Week.

Our First Reading from Isaiah talks about the Servant of Yahweh who was humiliated and later vindicated by God. He is also called the Suffering Servant. According to Him: "The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word" (Is 50.4a).

The blessing of a well-trained tongue given to the Servant was primarily for the good of the many others around Him who were weary from the drudgeries of life. Probably, having gone through suffering Himself, the Servant was able to empathise with those who were in a similar situation.



The Servant of Yahweh who empowered others met with brutal challenges. He said: "I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting" (Is 50.6).

Christians over the ages have seen a striking resemblance of the life of the Servant of Yahweh to the life of Jesus Christ.

Nobody can fully comprehend how God could humble Himself to the point of becoming man. Jesus, "though He was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited" (Phil 2.6).

The Gospel Reading for today sets the tone for the major theme of this Holy Week—the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Jesus knew Judas was the disciple who was going to betray Him. That notwithstanding, He did not ostracise him. He also knew Peter was going to deny knowledge of Him. He once again did not name and shame Peter.

This is the One we seek to imitate. After His passion there will be the triumphant Easter Sunday. In Him alone is our joy and peace.



The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

In the following Passion narrative: N.= narrator, †Christ, S.= Speakers other than Christ.

S. "What will you give me if I deliver him to you?"

N. And they paid him thirty pieces of silver. And from that moment he sought an opportunity to betray him. Now on the first day of unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying,

S. "Where will you have us prepare for you to eat the Passover?"

N. He said,

+ "Go into the city to such a one, and say to him, 'The Teacher says, My time is at hand; I will keep the Passover at your house with my disciples."

N. And the disciples did as Jesus had directed them, and they prepared the Passover.

When it was evening, he sat at table with the twelve disciples; and as they were eating, he said,

+"Truly, I say to you, one of you will betray me."

N. And they were very sorrowful, and began to say to him one after another,

S. "Is it I, Lord?"

N. He answered,

⁺ "He who has dipped his hand in the dish with me, will betray me.



The Son of man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born."

N. Judas, who betrayed him, said,

S. "Is it I, Master?"

N. He said to him,

+ "You have said so."

N. Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said,

+ Take, eat; this is my body."

N. And he took a chalice, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, saying,

+ "Drink of it, all of you; for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you I shall not drink again of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom."

N. And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. Then Jesus said to them,

+ "You will all fall away because of me this night; for it is written, 'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered.' But after I am raised up, I will go before you to Galilee."

N. Peter declared to him,

S. "Though they all fall away because of you, I will never fall away."

N. Jesus said to him,

+"Truly, I say to you, this very night, before the cock crows, you will deny me three times."

N. Peter said to him,

S. "Even if I must die with you, I will not deny you"

N. And so said all the disciples. Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, + "Sit here while I go over there and pray"

+ "Sit here, while I go over there and pray."

N. And taking with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, he began to be sorrowful and troubled. Then he said to them, † "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here, and watch with me."

N. And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed,

+ "My father, if it be possible, let this chalice pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will."

N. And he came to the disciples and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter,

+ "So, could you not watch with me one hour? Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

N. Again, for the second time, he went away and prayed,

+ "My Father, if this cannot pass unless I drink it, your will be done."

N. And again he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy. So, leaving them again, he went away and prayed for the third time, saying the same words. Then he came to the disciples and said to them,



+ "Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? Behold, the hour is at hand, and the Son of man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Rise, let us be going; see, my betrayer is at hand."

N. While he was still speaking, Judas came, one of the Twelve, and with him a great crowd with swords and cubs, from the chief priests and the elders of the people. Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying,

S. "The one I shall kiss is the man; seize him."

N. And he came up to Jesus at once and said,

- S. "Hail, Master!"
- N. And he kissed him. Jesus said to him,

+ "Friend, why are you here?"

N. Then they came up and laid hands on Jesus and seized him. And behold, one of those who were with Jesus stretched out his hand and drew his sword, and struck the slave of the high priest, and cut off his ear. Then Jesus said to him,

+ "Put your sword back into its place; for all who take the sword will perish by the sword. Do you think that I cannot appeal to my Father, and he will at once send me more than twelve legions of angels? But how then should the Scriptures be fulfilled, that it must be so?"

N. At that hour Jesus said to the crowds,

† "Have you come out as against a robber, with swords and clubs to capture me? Day after day I sat in the temple

teaching, and you did not seize me. But all this has taken place, that the Scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled." **N**. Then all the disciples deserted him and fled. Then those who had seized Jesus led him to Caiaphas the high priest, where the scribes and the elders had gathered. But Peter followed him at a distance, as far as the courtyard of the high priest, and going inside he sat with the guards to see the end. Now the chief priests and the whole council sought false testimony against Jesus that they might put him to death, but they found none, though many false witnesses came forward. At last two came forward and said,

S. "This fellow said, 'I am able to destroy the temple of God, and to build it in three days."

N. And the high priest stood up and said,

S. "Have you no answer to make? What is it that these men testify against you?"

N. But Jesus was silent. And the high priest said to him,

S. "I adjure you by the living God, tell us if you are the Christ, the Son of God."

N. Jesus said to him,

+ "You have said so. But I tell you, hereafter you will see the Son of man seated at the right hand of Power, and coming on the clouds of heaven."

N. Then the high priest tore his robes, and said,

S. "He has uttered blasphemy. Why do we still need witnesses? You have now heard his blasphemy. What is your judgment?"





N. They answered,

S. "He deserves death."

N. Then they spat in his face, and struck him; and some slapped him, saying,

S. "Prophesy to us, you Christ! Who is it that struck you?"

N. Now Peter was sitting outside in the courtyard. And a maid came up to him, and said,

S. "You also were with Jesus the Galilean."

N. But he denied it before them all, saying,

S. "I do not know what you mean."

N. And when he went out to the porch, another maid saw him, and she said to the bystanders,

S. "This man was with Jesus of Nazareth."

N. And again he denied it with an oath,

S. "I do not know the man."

N. After a little while the bystanders came up and said to Peter,

S. "Certainly you are also one of them, for your accent betrays you."

N. Then he began to invoke a curse on himself and swear,

S. "I do not know the man."

N. And immediately the cock crowed. And Peter remembered the saying of Jesus, "Before the crows, you will deny me three times." And he went out and wept bitterly. When morning came, all the chief priests and the elders of the people took counsel against Jesus to put him to death; and they bound him and led him away and delivered him to Pilate the governor. When Judas, his betrayer, saw that he was condemned, he repented and brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and the elders, saying,

S. "I have sinned in betraying innocent blood."

N. They said,

S. "What is that to us? See to it yourself."

N. And throwing down the pieces of silver in the temple, he departed; and he went and hanged himself. But the chief priests, taking the pieces of silver, said.

S. "It is not lawful to put them into treasury, since they are blood money."

N. So they took counsel, and bought with them the potter's field, to bury strangers in. Therefore that field has been called the Field of Blood to this day. Then was fulfilled what had been spoken by the prophet Jeremiah, saying, "And they took the thirty pieces of silver, the price of him on whom a price had been set by some of the sons of Israel, and they gave them for the potter's field, as the Lord directed me."

Now Jesus stood before the governor, and the governor asked him,

S. Are you the King of the Jews?"

N. Jesus said to him,

+ "You have said so."

N. But when he was accused by the chief priests and elders, he made no answer. Then Pilate said to him,



S. "Do you not hear how many things they testify against you?"

N. But he gave him no answer, not even to a single charge; so that the governor wondered greatly. Now at the feast the governor was accustomed to release for the crowd any one prisoner whom they wanted. And they had then a notorious prisoner, called Barabbas. So when they had gathered, Pilate said to them,

S. "Whom do you want me to release for you, Barabbas or Jesus who is called Christ?"

N. For he knew that it was out of envy that they had delivered him up. Besides, while he was sitting of the judgment seat, his wife sent word to him, "Have nothing to do with that righteous man, for I have suffered much over him today in a dream" Now the chief priests and the elders persuaded the people to ask for Barabbas and destroy Jesus. The governor again said to them,

S. "Which of the two do you want me to release for you?"

N. And they said.

S. "Barabbas."

N. Pilate said to them,

S. "Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ."

N. They all said,

S. "Let him be crucified."

N. And he said.

S. "Why, what evil has he done?"

N. But they shouted all the more,

S. "Let him be crucified."

N. So when Pilate saw that he was gaining nothing, but rather that a riot was beginning, he took water and washed his hands before the crowd, saying,

S. "I am innocent of this righteous man's blood; see to it yourselves."

N. And all the people answered,

S. "His blood be on us and on our children!"

N. Then he released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, delivered him to be crucified. Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the praetorium, and they gathered the whole battalion before him. And they stripped him and put a scarlet robe upon him, and plaiting a crown of thorns they put it on his head, and put a reed in his right hand. And kneeling before him they mocked him, saying,

S. "Hail, King of the Jews!"

N. And they spat upon him, and took the reed and struck him on the head. And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the robe, and put his own clothes on him, and led him away to crucify him. As they were marching out, they came upon a man of Cyrene, Simon by name; this man they compelled to carry his cross. And when they came to a place called Golgotha (which means the place of a skull), they offered him wine to drink, mingled with gall; but when he tasted it, he would not drink it. And when they had crucified



him, they divided his garments among them by casting lots; then they sat down and kept watch over him there. And over his head they put the charge against him, which read, "This is Jesus the King of the Jews." Then two robbers were crucified with him, one on the right and one on the left. And those who passed by derided him, wagging their heads, and saying, S. You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself! If you are the Son of God, come down from the cross."

N. So also the chief priests, with the scribes and elders, mocked him, saying,

S. "He saved others; he cannot save himself. He is the King of Israel; let him come down now from the cross, and we will believe in him. He trusts in God; let God deliver him now, if he desires him; for he said; "I am the Son of God."

N. And the robbers who were crucified with him also reviled him in the same way. Now from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour. And about the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice,

+ Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?"

N. That is

+ "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

N. And one of them at once ran and took a sponge, filed it with vinegar, and put it on a reed, and gave it to him to drink. But the others said,

"Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save him."

N. And Jesus cried again with a loud voice and yielded up his spirit.

All kneel and pause for a moment.

N. And behold, the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom; and the earth shook, and the rocks were split; the tombs also were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised, and coming out of the tombs after his resurrection they went into the holy city and appeared to many. When the centurion and those who were with him, keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were filled with awe, and said, S. "Truly this was the Son of God!"

N. There were also many women there, looking on from afar, who had followed Jesus from Galilee, ministering to him; among whom were Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James and Joseph, and the mother of the sons of Zebedee. When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who also was a disciple of Jesus. He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate ordered it to be given to him. And Joseph took the body, and wrapped it in a clean linen shroud, and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn in the rock; and he rolled a great stone to the door of the tomb, and departed. Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were there, sitting opposite the tomb. Next



day, that is, after the day of Preparation, the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered before Pilate and said,

S. "Sir, we remember how that impostor said, while he was still alive, 'After three days I will rise again.' Therefore order the tomb to be made secure until the third day, lest his disciples go and steal him away, and tell the people, "He has risen from the dead,' and the last fraud will be worse than the first." N. Pilate said to them,

S. "You have a guard of soldiers; go, make it as secure as you can."

N. So they went and made the tomb secure by sealing the stone and setting a guard.

The Triduum is a three day celebration of the central mystery of our faith: the death and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Holy Thursday He freely offers himself for our salvation.

Good Friday He suffers the Passion.

Holy Saturday All is still...

Easter Vigil We celebrate His Ressurection from the dead!

The Cross on which Jesus Christ died has become a gateway to eternal life.

Thursday April 6

Mass of the Lord's Supper

Exodus 12: 1-8. 11-14 / Psalm 116: 12-13. 15-16bc. 17-18 / 1 Corinthians 11: 23-26 / John 13: 1-15.

We Become What We Eat

Friends in Christ, on Holy Thursday, the Church celebrates Mass of the Lord's Supper during which she recalls how Jesus washed his disciples' feet and instituted both the Sacraments of the Holy Eucharist and Holy Orders. Jesus' command of "Do this in memory of me" leaves us with a timeless mandate for strengthening and spiritual renewal. Since the sacred priesthood is a prerequisite for the valid celebration of the sacraments, we are charged on servant–leadership, reflecting deeply on the Sacred Paschal Triduum and using the Mass of Chrism to continue the sacraments, assist the Bishop and contribute to the feeding of the poor.

Today begins the Sacred Paschal Triduum which commences "with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closes with evening prayer on Easter Sunday." This forms the crescendo of the paschal mystery. Chrism Mass which is part of



this celebration involves the blessing of the sacramental oils of chrism (for baptism, ordination, consecration and dedication), catechumens (for those preparing for baptism) and the sick by the bishop for the Church's use throughout the liturgical year. At that occasion, priests also renew their priestly commitment before their bishop "to signify the unity of the presbyterate of the diocese..."

For Pastoral reasons, most dioceses observe Chrism Masses on Tuesday of the Holy Week. This is to give priests ample opportunity to travel back to their parishes and prepare for the Triduum. Within the celebration. Cathedradicum (derived from the Latin Cathedra, which stands for the bishop's seat/chair in the cathedral from where he shepherds over the diocese) is observed - The custom involves parishes bringing gifts to the bishop for the poor and building of the diocese. Although this takes place on Tuesday of Holy Week, it is supposed take place on Holy Thursday or as the local ordinary (bishop) deems fit. Our liturgy challenges us to be what we eat by being witnesses of the Eucharistic Jesus who has given us himself and the priesthood as a ministry of sanctification. May the Holy Spirit help us to become truly a Eucharistic people in all we do and say.





Then he poured water into a basin, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him. He came to Simon Peter; and Peter said to him, "Lord, do you wash my feet?" Jesus answered him, "What I am doing you do not know now, but afterward you will understand." Beloved, we continue in our Triduum. This second day, counted all together with Holy Thursday and Holy Saturday, make a continuum. We are in the middle of a long, three-day celebration. Celebrating Good Friday. Good because the salvation of humanity has been accomplished. Jesus has made the ultimate sacrifice for our redemption. The words of R. J. Stevens' song "He paid a debt" come to mind.

He paid a debt he did not owe; I owed a debt I could not pay. I needed someone, to wash my sins away; now I can sing a brand new song Amazing grace, Lord Jesus paid the debt that I could never pay.

Friday April 7

Jesus chose the cross, a symbol of shame, public ridicule, and public disgrace and turns it into a powerful means of salvation. For this reason, we shall venerate the Crucifix in today's liturgy. In the passion narrative read today according to the account of St. John, Jesus exclaims '*tètèlèstai*' translated as "it is accomplished" or "it is complete". Your sins and my sins have been paid for in full.

What does this mean for us?

- 1. We are set free from the bondage of sin
- 2. Our hearts should be filled with gratitude to Christ for this act

3. We too must be agents of reconciliation : We must forgive people who have offended us. We too must seek forgiveness from those we have offended.

May the saving grace of the cross enable us to do this.

First Reading (Isaiah 52:13-53:12) A reading from the Book of Isaiah

Behold, my servant shall prosper, he shall be exalted and lifted up, and shall be very high. As many were astonished at him -his appearance was so marred, beyond human semblance, and his form beyond that of the sons of men - so shall he startle many nations; kings shall shut their mouths because of him; for that which has not been told them they shall see, and that which they have not heard they shall understand. Who has believed what we have heard? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed? For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or comeliness that we should look at him, and no beauty that we should desire him. He was despised and rejected by men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that made us whole, and with his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord



has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth. By oppression and judgement he was taken away; and as for his generation who considered that he was cut off out of the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people? And they made his grave with the wicked and with a rich man in his death, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth. Yet it was the will of the Lord to bruise him; he has put him to grief; when he makes himself an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring, he shall prolong his days; the will of the Lord shall prosper in his hand; he shall see the fruit of the travail of his soul and be satisfied; by his knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant, make many to be accounted righteous and he shall bear iniquities. Therefore I will divide him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he poured out his soul to death, and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and make made intercession for the transgressors.

The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathise with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sinning. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to him who was able to save him from death, and he was heard for his godly fear. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and being made perfect he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him. Gospel (John 18:1-19:42)

The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

In the following Passion narrative: N.= Narrator, †Christ, S.= Speakers other than Christ.

N. At that time: Jesus went forth with his disciples across the Kidron valley, where there was a garden, which he and his disciples entered. Now Judas, who betrayed him, also knew the place; for Jesus often met there with his disciples. So Judas procuring a band of soldiers and some officers from the chief priests and the Pharisees, went there with lanterns and torches and weapons. Then Jesus, knowing all that was to befall him, came forward and said to them,

+ "Whom do you seek?"

N. They answered him,

S. "Jesus of Nazareth."

N. Jesus said to them,

† "I am he."

N. Judas, who betrayed him, was standing with them. When he said to them, "I am he," they drew back and fell to the ground. Again he asked them,

+ "Whom do you seek?"

N. And they said,

S. "Jesus of Nazareth."



N. Jesus answered,

+ "I told you that I am he; so if you seek me, let these men go." **N**. This was to fulfil the word which he had spoken, "Of those whom you gave me I lost not one." Then Simon Peter, having a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's slave and cut off his right ear. The slave's name was Malchus. Jesus said to Peter,

+ "Put your sword into its sheath; shall I not drink the chalice which the Father has given me?"

N. So the band of soldiers and their captain and the officers of the Jews seized Jesus and bound him. First they led him to Annas; for he was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, who was high priest that year. It was Caiaphas who had given counsel to the Jews that it was expedient that one man should die for the people. Simon Peter followed Jesus, and so did another disciple. As this disciple was known to the high priest, he entered the court of the high priest along with Jesus, while Peter stood outside at the door. So the other disciple, who was known to the high priest, went out and spoke to the maid who kept the door, and brought Peter in. The maid who kept the door said to Peter,

S. "Are not you also one of this man's disciples?"

N. He said

S. "I am not."

N. Now the servants and the officers had made a charcoal fire, because it was cold, and they were standing and warming

themselves; Peter also was with them, standing and warming himself. The high priest then questioned Jesus about his disciples and his teaching. Jesus answered him,

† "I have spoken openly to the world; I have always taught in synagogues and in the temple, where all Jews come together; I have said nothing secretly. Why do you ask me? Ask those who have heard me, what I said to them; they know what I said."

N. When he had said this, one of the officers standing by struck Jesus with his hand, saying,

S. "Is that how you answer the high priest?"

N. Jesus answered him,

+ "If I have spoken wrongly, bear witness to the wrong; but if I have spoken rightly, why do you strike me?"

N. Annas then sent him bound to Caiaphas the high priest. Now Simon Peter was standing and warming himself. They said to him,

S. "Are not you also one of his disciples?"

N. He denied it and said,

S. "I am not."

N. One of the servants of the high priest, a kinsman of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, asked,

S. "Did I not see you in the garden with him?"

N. Peter again denied it; and at once the cock crowed. Then they led Jesus from the house of Caiaphas to the praetorium. It was early. They themselves did not enter the



praetorium so that they might not be defiled, but might eat the Passover. So Pilate went out to them and said,

S. "What accusation do you bring against this man?"

N. They answered him,

S. "If this man were not an evildoer, we would not have handed him over."

N. Pilate said to them.

S. "Take him yourselves and judge him by your own law." N. The Jews said to him,

S. "It is not lawful for us to put any man to death."

N. This was to fulfil the word which Jesus had spoken to show by what death he was to die. Pilate entered the praetorium again and called Jesus, and said to him,

S. "Are you the King of the Jews?"

N. Jesus answered.

+"Do you say this of your own accord, or did others say it to you about me?"

N. Pilate answered.

S. "Am I a Jew? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me; what have you done?"

N. Jesus answered.

t"My kingship is not of this world; if my kingship were of this world, my servants would fight, that I might not be handed over to the Jews; but my kingship is not from the world." N. Pilate said to him,

S. "So you are a king?"

Friday April 7

N. Jesus answered,

+ "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I have come into the world, to bear witness to the truth. Every one who is of the truth hears my voice."

N. Pilate said to him,

S. "What is truth?"

N. After he had said this, he went out to the Jews again, and told them,

S. "I find no crime in him. But you have a custom that I should release one man for you at the Passover; will you have me release for you the King of the Jews?"

N. They cried out again,

S. "Not this man, but Barabbas!"

N. Now Barabbas was a robber.

Then Pilate took Jesus and scourged him. And the soldiers plaited a crown of thorns, and put it on his head, and clothed him in a purple robe; they came up to him, saying, **S**. "Hail, King of the Jews!"

N. and struck him with their hands.

Pilate went out again, and said to them,

S. "Behold, I am bringing him out to you, that you may know that I find no crime in him."

N. So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe.

Pilate said to them,



S. "Here is the man!"

N. When the chief priests and the officers saw him, they cried out,

S. "Crucify him, crucify him!"

N. Pilate said to them,

S. "Take him yourselves and crucify him, for I find no crime in him."

N. The Jews answered him,

S. "We have a law, and by that law he ought to die, because he has made himself the Son of God."

N. When Pilate heard these words, he was even more afraid; he entered the praetorium again and said to Jesus,

S. "Where are you from?"

N. But Jesus gave no answer. Pilate therefore said to him,

S. "You will not speak to me? Do you not know that I have power to release you, and power to crucify you?"

N. Jesus answered him,

+"You would have no power over me unless it had been given you from above; therefore he who delivered me to you has the greater sin."

N. Upon this Pilate sought to release him, but the Jews cried out,

S. "If you release this man, you are not Caesar's friend; every one who makes himself a king sets himself against Caesar." N. When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus out and sat down on the judgement seat at a place called The Pavement, and in Hebrew, Gabbatha. Now it was the day of Preparation of the Passover; it was about the sixth hour. He said to the Jews, S. "Here is your King!"

N. They cried out,

S. "Away with him, away with him, crucify him!"

N. Pilate said to them,

S. "Shall I crucify your King?"

N. The chief priests answered,

S. "We have no king but Caesar."

N. Then he handed him over to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus, and he went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called the place of a skull, which is called in Hebrew Golgotha. There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, and Jesus between them. Pilate also wrote a title and put it on the cross; it read, "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews." Many of the Jews read this title, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, in Latin, and in Greek. The chief priests of the Jews then said to Pilate,

S. "Do not write, 'The King of the Jews,' but, 'This man said, I am King of the Jews.'"

N. Pilate answered,

S. "What I have written I have written."

N. When the soldiers had crucified Jesus they took his garments and made four parts, one for each soldier; also his



tunic. But the tunic was without seam, woven from top to bottom; so they said to one another,

S. "Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it to see whose it shall be." N. This was to fulfil the Scripture, "They parted my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots." So the soldiers did this. But standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, **+**"Woman, behold your son!"

N. Then he said to the disciple,

+"Behold, your mother!"

N. And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home. After this Jesus, knowing that all was now finished, said (to fulfil the Scripture),

† "I thirst."

N. A bowl full of vinegar stood there; so they put a sponge full of the vinegar on hyssop and held it to his mouth. When Jesus had received the vinegar, he said,

† "It is finished;"

N. and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

All kneel and pause for a moment in prayer.

N. Since it was the day of Preparation, in order to prevent the bodies from remaining on the cross on the Sabbath (for that

Friday April 7

Sabbath was a high day), the Jews asked Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away. So the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first, and of the other who had been crucified with him; but when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. But one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water. He who saw it has borne witness -his testimony is true, and he knows that he tells the truth - that you also may believe. For these things took place that the Scripture might be fulfilled, "Not a bone of him shall be broken." And again another Scripture says, "They shall look on him whom they have pierced." After this Joseph of Arimathea, who was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly, for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus, and Pilate gave him leave. So he came and took away his body. Nicodemus also, who had at first come to him by night, came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about a hundred pounds' weight. They took the body of Jesus, and bound it in linen cloths with the spices, as is the burial custom of the Jews. Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden and in the garden a new tomb where no one had ever been laid. So because of the Jewish day of Preparation, as the tomb was close at hand they laid Jesus there.

Adoration of the Holy Cross

Three times the priest or deacon invites the assembly to proclaim its faith:





After each response all adore the Cross briefly in silence. After the third response, the Cross and the candles are placed at the entrance to the sanctuary and the people approach, moving as in procession, to adore the Cross. They may make a simple genuflection or perform some other appropriate sign of reverence according to local custom.

During the adoration, suitable songs may be sung. All who have already adored the Cross remain seated. Where large numbers of people make individual adoration difficult, the priest may raise the Cross briefly for all to adore in silence.

Joyful Missionaries of the Risen Lord

Dear brethren, this night, we start the celebration of God's wonders for his people in the past, in the present and in the days to come. Easter indeed unifies the history of salvation and gives us the required force of the Spirit to be joyful missionaries of the Risen Lord wherever we are. After our journey through the Lenten season, we are ready to celebrate the victory of our God over all the forces of destruction especially the victory of life over death. The Easter celebrations start with the Easter vigil which is the mother of all the vigils (St Augustin). The next day, on the day of the Lord, we shall again assemble to sing alleluia with all our heart. Symbols and scriptures used in those celebrations point out that, if we follow Jesus, light of the world and firstborn of the dead, we shall live forever of the life of God.

The liturgy of the Easter vigil comprises four steps which indicate that we are a people walking under the guidance of the light of God, a people conceived and formed by the listening of the word of God, a people of baptized born from the death and resurrection of God and sustained by the body and blood of his Lord and finally a people sent to proclaim everywhere the mighty works of God who has called us out of darkness to his own wonderful light (cf. Preface I of Sundays).

It would be so interesting if each of us could leave the celebration of the vigil with the determination to be missionaries of the Risen Lord. Like the women, we do not need to see the empty tomb. We do not need to put our fingers in his wounds. We have heard the wonders that God did in the past and his promises to those who will let their lives be conformed to the death and resurrection of his son. We have heard his prophecies of peace and new life. It is now upon us to be other "Mary Magdalene" and to announce to all that the Risen Lord is waiting for us at all the junctions where people needs a word of hope or a service that restores them to the dignity of the children of God. As we renew our baptismal promises and share in the paschal banquet, let us remember that they are energetic bath and food for missionary works.

Solemn Beginning of the Vigil (Lucernarium)

Greeting

The priest and the ministers, one of whom carries the unlit paschal candle, approach the fire.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

- **1** The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.
- **2** Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- **3** The Lord be with you.

And with your spirit.

Blessing of the Fire

Dear brothers and sisters, on this most sacred night, in which our Lord Jesus Christ passed over from death to life, the Church calls upon her sons and daughters, scattered throughout the world, to come together to watch and pray. If we keep the memorial of the Lord's paschal solemnity in this way, listening to his word and celebrating his mysteries, then we shall have the sure hope of sharing his triumph over death and living with him in God.

Let us pray. O God, who through your Son bestowed upon the faithful the fire of your glory, sanctify this new

fire, we pray, and grant that, by these paschal celebrations, we may be so inflamed with heavenly desires, that with minds made pure we may attain festivities of unending splendour. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Preparation of the Candle

The priest cuts a cross in the paschal candle and traces the Greek letters alpha (A) and omega (Ω) and the numerals 2023, saying:

Christ yesterday and today, the Beginning and the End, the Alpha and the Omega. All time belongs to him, and all the ages. To him be glory and power, through every age and for ever. Amen.

When the marks have been made, the priest may insert five grains of incense into the candle in the form of a cross, saying: By his holy and glorious wounds, may Christ our Lord guard us and protect us. Amen.

The priest lights the paschal candle from the new fire, saying: May the light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

Procession

The deacon or another suitable minister holds the paschal candle and, three times during the procession to the altar, lifts it high and sings:



The Light of Christ. Thanks be to God. The Light of Christ. **Thanks be to God.**

After the first response, the priest lights his candle from the paschal candle. After the second response, all the people light their candles from the flame of the paschal candle.

After the third response, all the lights in the church are lit, except for the altar candles.

Easter Proclamation (Exsultet)

If, because of necessity, a lay cantor sings, he omits the parentheses. Exult, let them exult, the hosts of heaven, exult, let Angel ministers of God exult, let the trumpet of salvation sound aloud our mighty King's triumph!

Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King, let all corners of the earth be glad, knowing an end to gloom and darkness. Rejoice, let Mother Church also rejoice, arrayed with the lightning of his glory, let this holy building shake with joy, filled with the mighty voices of the peoples.

(Therefore, dearest friends standing in the awesome glory of this holy light, invoke with me, I ask you, the mercy of God almighty, that he, who has been pleased to number me, though unworthy, among the Levites, may pour into me his light unshadowed, that I may sing this candle's perfect praises.)

(The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit**.) Lift up your hearts. **We lift them up to the Lord**. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right and just**. It is truly right and just, with ardent love of mind and heart and with devoted service of our voice, to acclaim our God invisible, the almighty Father, and Jesus Christ, our Lord, his Son, his Only Begotten. Who for our sake paid Adam's debt to the eternal Father, and, pouring out his own dear Blood, wiped clean the record of our ancient sinfulness.

These, then, are the feasts of Passover, in which is slain the Lamb, the one true Lamb, whose Blood anoints the doorposts of believers.

This is the night when once you led our forebears, Israel's children,



from slavery in Egypt and made them pass dry-shod through the Red Sea.

This is the night that with a pillar of fire banished the darkness of sin.

This is the night that even now, throughout the world, sets Christian believers apart from worldly vices and from the gloom of sin, leading them to grace and joining them to his holy ones.

This is the night when Christ broke the prison-bars of death and rose victorious from the underworld.

Our birth would have been no gain, had we not been redeemed.

O wonder of your humble care for us! O love, O charity beyond all telling, to ransom a slave you gave away your Son!

O truly necessary sin of Adam, destroyed completely by the Death of Christ!

O happy fault that earned so great, so glorious a Redeemer!

O truly blessed night, worthy alone to know the time and hour when Christ rose from the underworld! This is the night of which it is written: The night shall be as bright as day, dazzling is the night for me, and full of gladness.

The sanctifying power of this night dispels wickedness, washes faults away, restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to mourners, drives out hatred, fosters concord, and brings down the mighty.

On this, your night of grace,

O holy Father,

accept this candle, a solemn offering, the work of bees and of your servants' hands,

an evening sacrifice of praise,

this gift from your most holy Church.

But now we know the praises

of this pillar, which glowing fire ignites for God's honour, a fire into many flames divided,

yet never dimmed by sharing of its light,

Liturgy of the Word

Second Reading (Genesis 22:1-18) A reading from the Book of Genesis

(For the short form: read between *)

*In those days: God tested Abraham, and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here am I." He said, "Take your son, your only-begotten son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering upon one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." *

So Abraham rose early in the morning, saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and his son Isaac; and he cut the wood for the burnt offering, and arose and went to the place of which God had told him. On the third day, Abraham lifted up his eyes and saw the place afar off. Then Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; I and the lad will go yonder and worship, and come again to you." And Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering, and laid it on Isaac his son; and he took in his hand the fire and the knife. So they went both of them together. And Isaac said to his father Abraham, "My father!" And he said, "Here am I, my son." He said, "Behold, the fire and the wood; but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" Abraham said, "God will provide himself the lamb for a burnt offering, my son." So they went both of them together.

Third Reading (Exodus 14:15-15:1). A reading from the Book of Exodus

In those days: The Lord said to Moses, "Why do you cry to me? Tell the sons of Israel to go forward. Lift up your rod, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it, that the sons of Israel may go on dry ground through the sea. And I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they shall go in after them, and I will get glory over Pharaoh and all his host, his chariots, and his horsemen. And the Egyptians shall know that I am the Lord, when I have gotten glory over Pharaoh, his chariots, and his horsemen." Then the angel of God who went before the host of Israel moved and went behind them; and the pillar of cloud moved from before them and stood behind them, coming between the host of Egypt and the host of Israel. And there was the cloud and the darkness; and the night passed without one coming near the other all night. Then Moses



stretched out his hand over the sea; and the Lord drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night, and made the sea dry land, and the waters were divided. And the sons of Israel went into the midst of the sea on dry ground, the waters being a wall to them on their right hand and on their left. The Egyptians pursued, and went in after them into the midst of the sea, all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen. And in the morning watch the Lord in the pillar of fire and cloud looked down upon the host the Egyptians, and discomfited the host of the Egyptians, clogging their chariot wheels so that they drove heavily; and the Egyptians said, "Let us flee from before Israel; for the Lord fights for them against the Egyptians". Then the Lord said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand over the sea, that the water may come back upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots, and upon their horsemen." So Moses stretched forth his hand over the sea, and the sea returned to its usual flow when the morning appeared; and the Egyptians fled into it, and the Lord routed the Egyptians in the midst of the sea. The waters returned and covered the chariots and the horsemen and all the host of Pharaoh that had followed them into the sea; not so much as one of them remained. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Fourth Reading (Isaiah 54:5-14) A reading from the Book of Isaiah

Your Maker is your husband, the Lord of hosts is his name; and the Holy One of Israel is your Redeemer, the God of the whole earth he is called. For the Lord has called you like a wife forsaken and grieved in spirit, like a wife of youth when she is cast off, says your God. For a brief moment I forsook you, but with great compassion I will gather you.

In overflowing wrath for a moment I hid my face from you, but with everlasting mercy I will have compassion on you, says the Lord, your Redeemer. "For this is like the days of Noah to me: I swore that the waters of Noah should no more go over the earth, so I have sworn that I will not be angry with you and will not rebuke you. For the mountains may depart and the hills be moved, but my mercy shall not depart from you and my covenant of peace shall not be removed, says the Lord; who has compassion on you. Thus says the Lord: "Ho, every one who thirsts, come to the waters; and he who has no money, come, buy and eat! Come,

buy wine and milk without money and without price. Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labour for that which does not satisfy? Listen diligently to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food. Incline your ear and come to me; hear, that your soul may live; and I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, merciful love David. Behold, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples. Behold, you shall call nations that you know not, and nations that knew you not shall run on you, because of the Lord your God, and of the Holy One of Israel, for he has glorified you. Epistle (Romans 6:3-11)_

A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans

Brethren: All of us who have been baptised into Christ Jesus were baptised into his death. We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our former man was crucified with him so that the sinful body might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For he who has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. For we know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.



Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Blessing of Baptismal Water

O God, who by invisible power accomplish a wondrous effect through sacramental signs and who in many ways have prepared water, your creation, to show forth the grace of Baptism;

O God, whose Spirit in the first moments of the world's creation hovered over the waters, so that the very substance of water would even then take to itself the power to sanctify;


O God, who by the outpouring of the flood foreshadowed regeneration, so that from the mystery of one and the same element of water would come an end to vice and a beginning of virtue;

O God, who caused the children of Abraham to pass dryshod through the Red Sea, so that the chosen people, set free from slavery to Pharaoh, would prefigure the people of the baptized;

O God, whose Son, baptized by John in the waters of the Jordan, was anointed with the Holy Spirit, and, as he hung upon the Cross, gave forth water from his side along with blood, and after his Resurrection, commanded his disciples: "Go forth, teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," look now, we pray, upon the face of your Church and graciously unseal for her the fountain of Baptism.

May this water receive by the Holy Spirit the grace of your Only Begotten Son, so that human nature, created in your image and washed clean through the Sacrament of Baptism from all the squalor of the life of old, may be found worthy to rise to the life of newborn children through water and the Holy Spirit.

May the power of the Holy Spirit, O Lord, we pray, come down through your Son into the fullness of this font, so that all who have been buried with Christ by Baptism into death may rise again to life with him. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Renunciation of Sin

Using one of the following formularies, the priest questions all the candidates together or individually.

1 Do you reject sins as to live in freedom of God's children? I do.

Do you reject the glamour of evil, and refuse to be mastered by sin? **I do.**

Do you reject Satan, father of sin and prince of darkness? **I do.**

- **2** Do you reject Satan, and all his works, and all his empty promises? **I do.**
- 3 Do you reject Satan? I do. And all his works? I do. And all his empty promises? I do.

Adult candidates may now be anointed with the Oil of Catechumens.



We anoint you with the oil of salvation in the name of Christ our Saviour. May he strengthen you with his power. **Amen.**

Profession of Faith

N., do you believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth? **I do.**

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died, and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father? **I do.**

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting? **I do.**

Baptism

The priest baptizes each candidate either by immersion or by the pouring of water.

N., I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Anointing after Baptism

Any newly baptized infants are anointed now with Chrism. The God of power and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin and brought you to new life through water and the Holy Spirit.

He now anoints you with the Chrism of salvation, so that, united with his people, you may remain for ever a member of Christ who is Priest, Prophet, and King. **Amen.**

Clothing with a Baptismal Garment

All the newly baptized receive a white garment.

N. and N., you have become a new creation and have clothed yourselves in Christ. Receive this baptismal garment and bring it unstained to the judgment seat of our Lord Jesus Christ, so that you may have everlasting life. **Amen.**

Presentation of a Lighted Candle

Godparents, please come forward to give to the newly baptized the light of Christ.

A godparent of each of the newly baptized lights a candle from the paschal candle and presents it to the newly baptized.

You have been enlightened by Christ. Walk always as children of the light and keep the flame of faith alive in your hearts. When the Lord comes, may you go out to meet him with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom. **Amen.**

Confirmation of Adults

The newly baptized adults with their godparents stand before the priest. My dear candidates for confirmation, by your baptism you have been born again in Christ and you have become members of Christ and of his priestly people. Now you are to share in the



outpouring of the Holy Spirit among us, the Spirit sent by the Lord upon his apostles at Pentecost and given by them and their successors to the baptized.

The promised strength of the Holy Spirit, which you are to receive, will make you more like Christ and help you to be witnesses to his suffering, death, and resurrection. It will strengthen you to be active members of the Church and to build up the Body of Christ in faith and love.

My dear friends, let us pray to God our Father, that he will pour out the Holy Spirit on these candidates for confirmation to strengthen them with his gifts and anoint them to be more like Christ, the Son of God.

Laying on of Hands

All-powerful God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, by water and the Holy Spirit you freed your sons and daughters from sin and gave them new life.

Send your Holy Spirit upon them to be their helper and guide.

Give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence. Fill them with the spirit of wonder and awe in your presence. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**



Anointing with Chrism

During the conferral of the sacrament an appropriate song may be sung. N., be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** Peace be with you. **And with your spirit.**

Blessing of Water (when no one is to be baptized)

Dear brothers and sisters, let us humbly beseech the Lord our God to bless this water he has created, which will be sprinkled upon us as a memorial of our Baptism. May he graciously renew us, that we may remain faithful to the Spirit whom we have received. (*Pause*)

Lord our God, in your mercy be present to your people who keep vigil on this most sacred night, and, for us who recall the wondrous work of our creation and the still greater work of our redemption, graciously bless this water. For you created water to make the fields fruitful and to refresh and cleanse our bodies. You also made water the instrument of your mercy: for through water you freed your people from slavery and quenched their thirst in the desert; through water the Prophets proclaimed the new covenant you were to enter upon with the human race; and last of all, through water, which Christ made holy in the Jordan, you have renewed our corrupted nature in the bath of regeneration.

Therefore, may this water be for us a memorial of the Baptism we have received, and grant that we may share in

the gladness of our brothers and sisters, who at Easter have received their Baptism. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Renewal of Baptismal Promises

While holding lit candles, the entire community renews its baptismal promises, if it has not already done so.

Dear brothers and sisters, through the Paschal Mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism, so that we may walk with him in newness of life. And so, now that our Lenten observance is concluded, let us renew the promises of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and his works and promised to serve God in the holy Catholic Church.

And so I ask you:

- Do you renounce Satan? I do. And all his works? I do. And all his empty show? I do.
- **2** Do you renounce sin, so as to live in the freedom of the children of God? **I do.**

Do you renounce the lure of evil, so that sin may have no mastery over you? **I do.**

Do you renounce Satan, the author and prince of sin? I do.

The community professes its faith:

Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth? **I do.**

Do vou believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father? I do.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting? I do.

And may almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit and bestowed on us forgiveness of our sins, keep us by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord, for eternal life. Amen. The priest sprinkles the people with blessed water, while an appropriate song is sung.

Prayer after Communion

Pour out on us, O Lord, the Spirit of your love, and in your kindness make those you have nourished by this paschal Sacrament, one in mind and heart. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Solemn Blessing — Easter

Bow down for the blessing.

May almighty God bless you through today's Easter Solemnity and, in his compassion, defend you from every assault of sin. **Amen.**

And may he, who restores you to eternal life in the Resurrection of his Only Begotten, endow you with the prize of immortality. **Amen.**

Now that the days of the Lord's Passion have drawn to a close, may you who celebrate the gladness of the Paschal Feast come with Christ's help, and exulting in spirit, to those feasts that are celebrated in eternal joy. **Amen.**

And may the blessing of almighty God, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, come down on you and remain with you for ever. **Amen.**
